I've had a strong interest over the years to sign on with various online ministries to receive articles relevant to faith, the church, and the world. They've proven valuable to me.

There is one article I've read and thought on – about how we sometimes get the mistaken view that the church is simply about us merely working and serving on behalf of the church. It seems that anyone can draw this conclusion, because church folk do expend a lot of energy to get things done. We have meetings to make decisions, we discuss what we've done and plan what's coming up, we fix things, rehearse, and decorate, we write something for the newsletter:), etc.

But, from of old, really - from God's perspective, this "doing things" is not primarily what first defines us as the church. The Bible is clear that those who are known as the church are above all else defined as God's own in one way or another, and that we are centered on *relationship* with Him and with each other. For example, we are *God's people* in that He calls us to Himself - He alone is and will be the only God we worship, obey, and bring glory to. We are also God's *own possession* - God has full rights to our lives because we are bought by the price of His Son Jesus' blood and death on the cross. We are as well *God's family* - we are brothers and sisters, with Jesus Himself teaching us specifically to know God as our Father.

This perspective of God's is vital to us as the church; we must not miss what this means in our life together. The article I mentioned above quotes Theologian Miroslav Volf. (I heard him speak once – very thoughtful and insightful.) Volf contends that "We are the church" doesn't mean "We meet occasionally" or "We cooperate in a current project." Instead, we actually become part of one another. This sounds like Paul's exhortation that in the Body of Christ, "each member belongs to all the others" (Rom. 12:5). Here, of course, is another example of the kind of relationship that defines us, in that we are the Body of Christ with Jesus as our Head; we belong to Him and, to Paul's point, we belong to each other, one and all.

Certainly though, we face temptations which aim to close us off from another. What do these look like? Disagreements that show up and seek to divide us, personal preferences which can ignore and reject someone else's input, opinions toward a brother or sister which can render judgment against his or her inherent worth, or rejection of involvement in the church that can foster waywardness and isolation from the body itself. For sure, we can never let these kinds of things have even a sliver of success in pulling us apart, by even one fraction of a fraction. The calling for all of us is to pursue honoring and strengthening our belonging to each other. Central to this is for us to regularly do a heart-check to make sure that we have not failed this calling; and if we find that we have failed, we need to then make amends with one another to the fullest measure of reconciliation. We church folk fail as we all know, but we have the opportunity and more so, the directive, to rectify our mistakes and seek to restore any broken relationships.

By God's grace and by the power of His Holy Spirit in us, we can (and must) keep the bonds of our belonging to each other strong, and stronger still. To do this, and because we are God's, we follow the straightforward command: *Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God...* (1 John 1.7)

With the focus of our belonging to each other as of first importance, the "getting done" of ministry we do - we will do better.

It is our pleasure to share all our church has to offer and we want to ensure you don't miss a thing.



Tuesday	Clarity and Effective Job Posting and Description: Pray for clarity as to the characteristics, goals and the key areas included. Pray we don't settle for too little or aim too high and make the position unreasonable or unattainable. See I Timothy 3:1-2
Wednesday	Hearing God's Voice: Pray we hear God's voice with clarity and feel peace as we discern whom to interview. Pray that the church's needs and desires are put before our own as we read applications, listen to sermons, and talk to candidates. See John 10:14

Thursday	Asking the Right Questions: Pray we will know the right questions to ask as we represent the church throughout the process. Pray we would represent CCBJ accurately and attractively and move efficiently through the interview process. See Matthew 5:16
Friday	Peace for Future Pastor's Family: Pray the future pastor, spouse and family to feel the same peace and excitement as we feel about the candidate. Pray that the candidate will have clarity during our interactions and know whether or not they are called by God to CCBJ. See Philippians 4:7
Saturday	Peace for the Congregation: Pray the entire congregation will feel peace and confirmation during congregational meetings and the voting process. Pray for unity of the committee, staff and congregation. Pray no person has an agenda that would be a distraction or deterrent from God's work. Pray for a smooth transition for the pastor and family into the church and community. See Colossians 3:14
