"The only constant in life is change."



I find it interesting that this quote dates back to Heraclitus, a Greek philosopher that lived around 500BC!! I find this is one of the oldest

and most quoted quotes from history. We have known this truth for thousands of years! Astounding, isn't it? What else is amazing is that we are still afraid of change today. We want to live in the familiar and the routine we tell ourselves. However, if you think about this, it is VERY conditional.

So at some point, It wasn't always like this: we didn't mind change, we didn't mind when things evolved over time, a growing family, a promotion in our career. But at some point in our lives, we made a choice...."I like it here and here I will stay". Sometimes, we do need a break, to recover or heal or just celebrate. This is not that time! God is inviting us to move forward into a new spring of life! He is inviting this church into an exciting place, space, and time.

So we are open now to change, to difference songs or ways of doing things, to a different pastor!!:)

Our next question is: How do we change, as an individual, and as a community then?

- 1 We decide to make a choice to trust the Holy Spirit's leading us forward.
- 2 We accept that the changes God is bringing about is for our growth and benefit.
- 3 We enter in with a heart of gratitude, joy, and expectation. We are walking with God.

Lastly, we practice! There will be mistakes. Some songs will make us feel more connected to God, some sermons will make us feel joy, others will be challenging. The point is that we all remain a part of the process.

Remember, you cannot stay in step with the Holy Spirit if you refuse to live in the present reality you are in. God says, "Here I am". We will meet Him there.


